



TUTORING TIP

Looking for a way to gauge progress? Try a Literacy Log!



A literacy log is a great way to track how a learner's growing literacy skills are changing their day-to-day life. Since the ultimate goal of Adult literacy instruction is to increase the amount of reading and writing that learners do outside of class, a literacy log can serve a dual purpose: as a method for tracking, and a source of motivation.


Creating a log is simple. At the end of a tutoring session, set aside about ten minutes for a learner to reflect on the writing and reading they've done, outside of class, over the past week. Ask them to write these activities down. Repeat this exercise on a regular basis to build your log.

A literacy log allows learners to really see the impact of their growing literacy skills. Together, you can use the log to assess progress, and critically reflect on where you have been and where you are going. What is something the learner is reading now that they avoided before? What types of things are they still avoiding? How can you adapt authentic materials (real-life things learners want/need to read) during your tutoring time to fit with their current interests? How can you use authentic materials to achieve new milestones?




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
