Reading books is not only for gaining knowledge but having hope.


So, I will continue to read.

SERVINGS: 8 PREPPING TIME: 10 MIN COOKING TIME: 20 MIN

Ingredients

1 (16 oz) package bow tie pasta

1 tsp olive oil

2 cloves garlic, minced

2 skinless, boneless chicken

breasts cut into bite-sized pieces

1 pinch crushed red pepper flakes

1/2 cup pesto sauce

1/3 cup oil-packed sun-dried tomatoes,

drained and cut into strips

Directions

- 1.Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add pasta and cook until al dente, 8 to 10 minutes; drain.
- 2.Heat oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Saute garlic until tender, then stir in chicken and season with red pepper flakes. Cook until the chicken is golden and cooked through.
- 3. Combine pasta, chicken, pesto, and sun-dried tomatoes in a large bowl; toss to coat evenly.

A tip from other cooks: Double the amount of pesto in this recipe for a more flavorful dish! Or, add some pine nuts on top for a little crunch.



The Wilson Reading System


(The Wilson Reading System, also known as WRS, is an instructional program that follows a highly structured series of steps. Tutors must be WRS-trained to effectively use the system.)

Evan: I'm quite pleased with Hugo's rapid progress into Wilson level 3. Hugo does his homework and attends each session consistently.




