TOTAL PREP/COOKING TIME: 30 MIN SERVINGS: 4

Ingredients

4 tsp canola oil, divided

4 boneless pork loin chops

3 cups sweet onion slices

2 medium Granny Smith apples,

peeled and sliced

1/2 cup water

2 tbsp brown sugar

1 tbsp cider vinegar

1 tsp garlic powder

1/2 tsp salt

1/2 tsp pepper


1/4 tsp dried rosemary, crushed

Directions

- 1. In a large skillet, heat 2 tsp canola oil over medium-high heat; cook chops until browned, about 3 minutes on each side. Remove meat; set aside and keep warm.
- 2. In same skillet, cook and stir onion in remaining 2 tsp canola oil until golden brown, about 7 minutes. Add apple slices; cook and stir 3 minutes longer.
- 3. Combine the water, brown sugar, vinegar, garlic powder, salt, pepper, and rosemary. Stir into skillet. Bring to a boil. Return meat to pan. Reduce heat; cover and cook until apples are crisp-tender, about 6-8 minutes. Let stand 5 minutes before serving.

Health Tip: Onions contain organic sulfur compounds, which helps reduce the level of cholesterol in your body. (source)




