Mixed Berries and Banana Smoothie

SERVINGS: 1 TO 2 TOTAL PREP/COOKING TIME: 10 MINS

Ingredients

1 cup frozen mixed berries 3/4 cup orange juice 1/4 cup low-fat vanilla yogurt 1 frozen ripe banana 1 tsp honey

Directions

Combine the berries, orange juice, yogurt, banana, and honey in a blender and puree until smooth.

If you are using a blender where the blending cup inverts onto the blender/blades, be sure to put your heaviest ingredients in first, that way they weigh down the lighter ingredients.

Health Tip: Smoothies can help us increase our fiber intake! The United States Department of Agriculture recommends 25 to 38 grams of fiber a day, but the average American is estimated to only take in about 16 grams a day. Because smoothies are loaded with fruits and vegetables, they also tend to be loaded with fiber. Having adequate fiber intake helps lower your cholesterol levels, control blood sugar, and, according to some studies, live longer.
